The Cover Band delivers high-energy, engaging performances by covering a variety of musical themes as a cover band in a bar or pub environment.

The Cover Band consists of four musicians with instrumentation that includes Bass, Drums, Lead Guitar and either Keys or Rhythm Guitar. At least two members must also provide lead vocals. The Cover Band performs without the use of backing tracks and covers a wide range of American popular music from the 1960s through today.

4-Piece Cover Band including:

- A Band Leader with exceptional talent management skills.
- Advanced individual musical proficiency as a vocalist and/or instrumentalist.
- Advanced ensemble musicianship.
- Repertoire of 200-250 American popular music songs from the 1960's through today.
- Ability to adjust existing repertoire to meet branding and programming needs.
- Ability to read musical notation is preferred although not required.
- A developed social media presence is preferred.

Due to health and safety the following is required.

- A BMI (Body Mass Index) of under 30.
- An approved pre employment medical exam, including drug test. (This is completed on confirmation of a position)
- Respect for rules on board regarding zero tolerance policies.
 - Zero Tolerance Policies include Guest Fraternalization, Theft, Drug Use, Alcohol Abuse, Harassment, Fighting, and Tampering with Safety Equipment.
- Where applicable, a C1/D visa and Police Background check may be required.

For your audition, please produce or share a video, which demonstrates the following genres:

- Classic Rock
- Disco
- Motown
- 80s Pop/Rock
- 90s thru now
- Sing-Along
- Country
- Oldies (50s/60s)

- R&B
- The video does not need to be professional quality, a home recording is fine.
- You don't need to perform full tunes, perform at least half and then segue into another.
- Be sure to perform in a variety of keys and use a variety of accompaniment patterns.
- The video should feature most, if not all, musicians demonstrating their improvising skills on their instrument.
